

DETAILED ITINERARY

DAY 1: THE OLIVE EXCLUSIVE ALL-SUITE HOTEL, WINDHOEK



DAILY NOTES

Welcome to Namibia! Upon arrival in Windhoek, meet-and-greet and transfer to the Olive Exclusive Hotel for your first night in Namibia. Rest up this evening before the real adventure begins.

WINDHOEK

Windhoek, Namibia's capital, is located in a basin between the Khomas Highland and the Auas and Eros mountains. With 150,000 inhabitants, it is also the biggest city in the country. It is a pretty small city, situated in a valley and combines the architecture of a modern city with its German colonial heritage, most notably in its city center. Early buildings such as the Alte Festung (old fort), Christuskirche and Tinenpalast (the parliament buildings) are of a particular historical interest. Don't be caught off guard by Namibia's friendly citizens, enthusiastic about entertaining their guests to ensure a great visit. One of the most remarkable features of Windhoek is the mountains and hills that encircle the city. Standing 5,428 ft. above sea level, these peaks create breathtaking views and are a site to be seen.



OVERNIGHT: THE OLIVE EXCLUSIVE ALL-SUITE HOTEL

The Olive Exclusive is a cool, contemporary and stylish boutique hotel where sleek modern lines complement organic textures, natural furnishings, an eco-friendly approach and dedicated personal service. Simple elegance is key, from the organic rough-hewn wooden benches and side tables, through the sculpted chunk of

granite coffee table in the guest lounge, to walls clad in abstract Namibian landscapes by well-known South African designer and photographer Micky Hoyle.

The seven suites are individually decorated to reflect a different region in Namibia, and each has its own lounge area with fireplace and dining room, for private dining. Wide glass doors open onto spacious decks where you can relax on a shady daybed and enjoy al fresco lunches. Enjoy the night in an extra-length bed dressed in crisp, pure-cotton linen, or indulge in a bubble bath in a freestanding tub with sweeping mountain views. Air-conditioning, high definition satellite TV and iPod docking stations are standard, as is a computer with WiFi access. The fully stocked mini bar is complete with a premium wine selection; toast the setting sun in fine style.

DAYS 2 & 3: ANDBEYOND SOSSUSVLEI DESERT LODGE, SOSSUSVLEI



DAILY NOTES

Transfer from the Olive Exclusive Hotel to the desert regions of Sossusvlei and continue to Sossusvlei Desert Lodge for three nights. Treat yourself to an excursion to some of the highest sand dunes in the world at Sossusvlei as well as the breathtaking Sesriem Canyon. This six-hour nature drive in air conditioned vehicles offers excellent photographic opportunities as well as a mouth-watering breakfast in the shade of camel-thorn trees. While here you'll want to take advantage of scenic drives in open 4x4 safari vehicles, quad biking through the desert, guided nature walks, stargazing and picnic excursions. For a really memorable morning, add a sunrise hot air balloon outing over the world's highest dunes followed by a champagne breakfast (optional - extra cost).

SOSSUSVLEI

The iconic red sand dunes of Namibia!! One of the natural wonders of Africa.



OVERNIGHT: ANDBEYOND SOSSUSVLEI DESERT LODGE

Cradled against the ancient mountains, the &Beyond Sossusvlei Desert Lodge is renowned for its sophisticated desert experience. Your luxurious accommodation overlooks the stark yet beautiful Namib Desert. Designed to capture the splendor and solitude of the desert, just ten stone and glass desert villas are spread out along the curve of the escarpment allowing absolute privacy. Each air-conditioned suite features a private veranda, split-level bedroom and living room with fireplace, glass-encased bathroom and outdoor shower. The villas

are equipped with a star-viewing skylight, discreet CD system, custom-stocked personal bar and compact spotting scope for magnificent stargazing.

The Lodge features a fire-lit bar, comfortable sitting room, mezzanine library, swimming pool, wraparound verandas and a safari shop. Sossusvlei Mountain Lodge is renowned for its exciting bush breakfasts and dune dinners in dramatic desert locations. After dinner, a resident astronomer will reveal the mysteries of the clear desert night sky through a large telescope.

Treat yourself to an excursion to some of the highest sand dunes in the world at Sossusvlei as well as the breathtaking Sesriem Canyon. This six hour nature drive, in air conditioned vehicles offers excellent photographic opportunities as well as a mouth-watering breakfast in the shade of camel-thorn trees.

DAY 4: GOCHEGANAS NATURE RESERVE & WELLNESS VILLAGE, CENTRAL NAMIBIA



DAILY NOTES

This morning, proceed to GocheGanas in the central Namibian highlands for your next overnight. Namibia is a vast country and GocheGanas is ideally situated to break up the long journey to Cheetah Conservation Fund. (Driving direct from Sossusvlei to CCF is not feasible in a single day.) Here, Namibian culture is celebrated with local arts and crafts while the tranquil surroundings provide a haven to sit back, relax and take it all in. Not to mention the breathtaking landscapes and herds of game you can admire in the surrounding area. Venture out on game drives or bush walks, or simply take a load off at the Wellness Village - one of the highlights at GocheGanas; the choice is yours.

CENTRAL NAMIBIA

The central Namibian highlands are much cooler and less harsh than the arid lowlands that make up the majority of the country. This is great cattle ranching country and most tourism facilities have their origins in cattle and more recently game ranching.



OVERNIGHT: GOCHEGANAS NATURE RESERVE & WELLNESS VILLAGE

"GOCHEGANAS" - a descriptive Damara name, meaning: "Place of Camel Thorns, abounding with Candle-Pod Acacias" is more than just a place, it is an experience....

Located a mere 29km south east from Windhoek, and situated on a hilltop overlooking a spectacular landscape, this luxurious Lodge offers a unique combination of Wildlife, Nature and Wellness experiences.

GocheGanas offers 16 luxurious chalets, under thatched roof, with uninterrupted views over the Nature Reserve. All rooms are equipped with en suite bathrooms, air conditioning, mini bars, TV and DVD/CD players.

Complimenting and enhancing the Lodge, is our Wellness Village, boasting state of the art wellness facilities, as well as heated indoor pool, cave sauna and fitness and gym facilities. A variety of wellness treatments and massages are offered.

Game abound on the GocheGanas Nature Reserve, with 25 different large game species totaling approximately 1,600 animals roaming across the reserve. Our early morning and late afternoon game drives remain a highlight for many of our visitors.

DAYS 5 & 6: BABSON HOUSE, WATERBERG REGION



DAILY NOTES

Depart Central Namibia and follow the scenic route to the Cheetah Conservation Fund (CCF) and Babson House in the Waterberg Region. An array of activities await you at CCF including, you guessed it, plenty of cheetah. Dive into a guided tour of the Center or educational presentation; watch the resident cheetahs feed and learn more about this amazing mammal and its race against extinction. We suggest saving time for the cheetah runs where watch the resident cheetahs – and the world’s fastest land animal – stretch their legs on the lure course. Meet with Dr. Laurie Marker, Founder and Executive Director of CCF (and friend of EJ). Picnic lunch or simply relax on the veranda overlooking the magnificent Waterberg Plateau to reflect.

WATERBERG REGION

The Waterberg Region, located in the majestic Waterberg Mountains, is a tourism gem with several great nature reserves and a wealth of wildlife roaming its bushveld savannah. Its major attractions include hot springs, South Africa’s first-ever savannah biosphere reserve, the bird-rich Nyslvley Wetland and the archaeological site of Makapans Valley.



OVERNIGHT: BABSON HOUSE

For those who wish to experience the world of CCF (Cheetah Conservation Fund) at the next level, there is The Babson House, CCF’s luxurious guest house. Sleeping up to 6 people in accommodations reminiscent of Out of Africa and the colonial comfort of the 1940’s, guests can enjoy sundowners on a private veranda

overlooking the ever-changing colors of the spectacular Waterberg Plateau. Of course, cheetahs are never far away. CCF's resident cheetahs live only a few meters away and can be watched from the verandah.

Guests may lounge in the deep leather couches in the living room while a private chef prepares a special meal. Lunch is served on the veranda while dinner is served at the dining room table beneath an imposing wildlife-themed chandelier. Later, as the sounds of the African night fill the darkness, visitors sleep soundly in sumptuously furnished bedrooms, each of which has its own spacious bathroom equipped with high-quality fittings.

DAYS 7 - 9: ONGAVA LODGE, ONGAVA PRIVATE GAME RESERVE



DAILY NOTES

Continue next to Ongava Lodge for a three-night stay. Enjoy lunch, then set out on an afternoon game drive on the Ongava Private Game Reserve. Return to the lodge for dinner and, in the evening, gather at the main thatched dining area to enjoy a drink at the bar while watching wildlife congregate at the floodlit waterhole. Over the next two days, venture out for various game drives in Etosha National Park to explore the area around Okaukuejo. Other activities include bird watching and nature walks. For serious photographers, the hide is the main draw. And, of course, rhino tracking is a real highlight here.

ONGAVA PRIVATE GAME RESERVE

Ongava Game Reserve is a private reserve created in the early 1990s by a group of Namibian, English, American and South African partners who joined together and bought 74,000 acres of land on Etosha's southern boundary. The aim of this venture was to create Namibia's finest private game reserve and to create a buffer for Etosha along its southern boundary. Ongava (meaning rhinoceros in Herero) was born, and a massive rehabilitation and restocking program took place. White rhino were introduced and over time black rhino migrated onto the reserve. Today Ongava holds one of the largest rhino custodianships for the Namibian government in the country and is one of the few private game reserves in southern Africa where guests can see both black and white rhino. Many thousands of animals are now found on Ongava including elephant, giraffe, gemsbok, springbok, red hartebeest, eland, wildebeest, zebra and the rare blackfaced impala. Lion, leopard and cheetah have also moved back onto the reserve.



OVERNIGHT: ONGAVA LODGE

Ongava Lodge is situated along the southern boundary of Etosha National Park in the privately owned Ongava Game Reserve. Ongava is the ideal place from which to base your activities when visiting Etosha. Accommodation comprises twelve air-conditioned brick, rock and thatch chalets, each with en-suite facilities. Meals are either served in the main dining area under thatch with a view over the camp's water hole, or on the dining deck under the stars. Activities include game drives in open 4x4 vehicles into the Okaukeujo area of Etosha where Lion, Elephant, Cheetah, Gemsbok, Springbok and Hartebeest can be seen at many of the waterholes in the park. In addition, hides and walks with armed guides are enjoyed on the private reserve. Ongava has resident White and Black Rhino, giving guests staying at Ongava the unique opportunity to see both of these charismatic species. Ongava Lodge was listed on the Condé Naste Traveller Gold Reserve List for 2005.

DAYS 10 - 12: SERRA CAFEMA CAMP, KAOKOVELD



DAILY NOTES

Transfer to the local airstrip for a light aircraft flight to Serra Cafema on the Kunene River. Upon arrival at the airstrip, meet your guide and transfer through spectacular scenery to Serra Cafema Camp, where you will stay for the next three nights. After a savory lunch, set out on your first nature drive in this unique area, or stretch your legs on a nature walk. We suggest cultural excursions to visit the local Himba - one of the last true nomadic people on the planet.

During your stay, explore the surrounding Namib Desert and the lush oasis along the river on nature drives and/or carefully guided quad bike excursions through the fragile dunes. It is especially important to tread lightly here to preserve the dunes and the delicate habitats of this fascinating landscape. Spend a late afternoon lounging on the camp's front deck soaking up the contrasts of desert and water, or boat (seasonal) on the Kunene River. The crocodiles and water birds seem out of place in this surreal, lunar-like landscape. Simply walking in the remote mountain and river valleys is also a highlight as you soak in the magic of the area at your own pace.

KAOKOVELD

The Kaokoveld is a dry, mountainous and relatively undeveloped region that takes in the harsh beauty of the Skeleton Coast and the coppery sands of the northern Namib Desert. The area is inhabited by three main ethnic groups - the Damara, Herero and Himba people - each with their unique customs, traditions and rituals.



OVERNIGHT: SERRA CAFEMA CAMP

Located near the Angola border, Serra Cafema is the most remote camp in Southern Africa. The camp's Portuguese name comes from the mountains to the north that dominates the skyline. This region is shared with the wonderful Himba people who are some of the last true nomadic people in Africa. These friendly people are closely related to the Herero and both ethnic groups speak the same language. The Himba are a pastoral people. They predominantly breed cattle and goats and lead a nomadic life. Depending on the time of year, they move with their herds to different watering places. Clothes, hairstyle and jewelry are all of particular significance to the Himba and are part of their tradition and culture. Even newborn babies are adorned with pearl necklaces. When the children are a little older, bangles made of beaten copper and shells are added.

The Kunene River is the only permanent source of water in the whole region and the river creates a lush oasis along its banks surrounded by rugged mountains and sand dunes. You will spend time in breathtaking landscape scenes in the Hartmann Valley, to the south of the camp, with herds of springbok, ostrich and even leopard. Traverse sand dunes on 4x4 safaris and explore the Kunene River on boat excursions where one can watch Kunene crocodiles basking the river banks, while looking out for Southern Africa's rarest bird, the Cinderella Waxbill. Walking trails in the remote mountain and river valleys are a highlight for those who enjoy foot safaris.

Under big, shady Albida trees you will find a small, rustic and peaceful camp with all the comforts in fully furnished Meru tents with en-suite bathroom facilities. The camp's six tents are raised off the ground. Attention to detail, elevated decks and simple structures of wood, canvas and thatch create a camp that is at one with its surroundings. The dining room, bar and pool look out over the Kunene River. Rapids just below camp provide a calming ambiance; guests fall asleep to the sound of rushing water, while by day they explore one of the driest deserts in the world. You'll also find a small swimming pool. The cool winds that blow from the Atlantic help to keep the camp cool even in summer.

The variety of activities to explore the breathtaking landscape includes informative nature drives that tread lightly on the fragile habitats and boating on the Kunene River, where crocodiles and waterbirds seem out of place in this moonscape environment. Walking in the remote mountain and river valleys are also a highlight, as is a visit to a Himba settlement, should the nomadic people be in the area. The fairy circle phenomenon is best viewed in the Hartmann's Valley.

DAYS 13 & 14: HOANIB SKELETON COAST CAMP, SKELETON COAST



DAILY NOTES

Take a scheduled charter flight to Hoanib Skeleton Coast (via Doro Nawas). Hoanib Skeleton Coast Camp is scenically located in a broad valley at the confluence of two tributaries of the dry Hoanib River in the northern part of the private Palmwag Concession. Its location thus straddles the Palmwag area and the iconic Skeleton Coast National Park, in one of the most remote areas of the Kaokoveld.

The vast, isolated wilderness offers excellent viewing of Namibia's distinctive desert-adapted wildlife. Explore the Hoanib Riverbed and seek out desert-adapted elephant, giraffe, gemsbok and springbok. Don't miss the scenic drive to and flight back from the Skeleton Coast (weather permitting) with its stark shores and enormous seal colonies. Don't forget to take a stroll through Hoanib's spectacular moon-like landscape between excursions.

SKELETON COAST

Known by the Bushmen as the "land God made in anger" the Skeleton Coast is remoteness at its best. Thousands of miles of sandy desert dotted with shipwrecks meet with the cold waters on the Atlantic and somehow an amazing array of wildlife and flora manages to survive in this harsh but beautiful environment.



OVERNIGHT: HOANIB SKELETON COAST CAMP

The name “Skeleton Coast” conjures up romantic images of desolate beauty, and proudly remote Hoanib in the Kaokoveld does not disappoint. The dry bed of the Hoanib River supports a thin green ribbon of vegetation and the wild beaches of the Atlantic coast are within reach, with their noisy seal colonies and eerily quiet shipwreck remnants.

Eight large en-suite tents (including one family unit) and the main area provide shady viewpoints, while nature drives into the surrounding area reveal a wealth of desert-adapted wildlife. Desert-adapted lion and brown hyaena may also be glimpsed in this vast but far from lifeless landscape.

- Take a drive down to the Skeleton Coast and a scenic flight back to camp to see such a diverse area both on the ground and in the air.

CONDITIONS OF TRAVEL FOR SOUTHERN AFRICA

AIR TRANSPORTATION: International air is not included. Flights within Africa as specified in the itinerary.

BAGGAGE ALLOWANCES: The following is purely a guide line as allowances vary depending on the airline flown, class and routing. For a comprehensive explanation of each individual airline's baggage policy please refer to their website.

Passengers weighing more than 200 pounds must please advise us in advance as an extra seat may have to be added into the pricing at the airline's discretion for safety reasons.

SAA domestic flights - 1 checked in piece at a maximum of 23kg (50lb) in economy class. Hand luggage not to exceed 8kgs (18lb) with maximum dimensions of 52cm (L) 40cm (W) 23cm (H) Total 115cm (45in).

SAA regional flights - 2 checked in pieces at a maximum of 23kg (50lb) in economy class. Hand luggage not to exceed 8kgs (18lb)

Comair/BA - 1 checked bag of 23kgs (50lbs) restricted to dimensions of 90cm (L) 75cm (W) 43cm (H) (35in x 29in x 16in), including handle, pockets and wheels and 1 piece of hand luggage weighing no more than 7kg (15lbs) with dimensions 56cm (W) 36cm (H) x 23cm (L) (22in x 14in x 9in) plus a handbag / laptop or briefcase.

Federal Air - Total baggage of no more than 20kgs in soft-sided bags. An additional 20kg may be purchased at the rate of an additional seat, or extra luggage may be stored for a fee in the Federal Air storage facilities.

LAM Airlines: economy class 20 kg (44 lb).

SA Airlink - domestic and regional routes 20kg per person 90cm (L), 45cm (W) 7 (H) and 1 piece of hand luggage, maximum weight 8 kgs The allowance on inter camp transfers or "lodge hops" is very strictly applied and is as follows:

South Africa: 20kgs (44lbs) per person in a soft duffel-type bag, this includes hand luggage and camera equipment.

Travelers entering South Africa or Mozambique from a yellow fever zone will require proof of yellow fever vaccination. It is a sensible precaution for visitors to take one of the preventive pills that are in common use against malaria if you will be in the Kruger area, Mozambique, or Botswana. Water is safe to drink in most areas but to avoid problems it is always advisable to drink bottled water which will be provided for you free of charge in the vehicles.

RATES: All rates quoted are based on tariffs and value of foreign currencies in relation to the U.S. dollar in effect as of the time of booking and are subject to change. Should increases be forced on us by airlines, exchange rates, etc., we reserve the right to surcharge, up to a maximum of 10% of the tour fare.

NOT INCLUDED: Cost of passport and visa fees, and service charges for obtaining visa fees; excess baggage charges levied by airlines; all items not specifically covered in the itinerary; gratuities to driver/guides and
